 - B- **Upside down values (3:1-2; 6:11-12)**
 - C- **Covetousness and its fruits (3:11; 7:13)**
- III- **The Coming Kingdom and its King.**
 - A- **The Kingdom—(Micah 4:1-3)**
 - B- **The King--Micah 5:2**
- IV- **What Does God Require?**
 - A- **The importance of remembering (Micah 6:3-5).**
 - B- **His three requirements (Micah 6:6-8).**
